

For those who read out loud: English Pronunciations for
Vowels in Transliterations and Footnotes:

- ē (η, eta) = a as in day (long a)
- ō (ω, Ω, omega) = o as in omega
- a (α, alpha) = a as in father
- e (ε, epsilon) = e as in egg (short e)
- i (ι, iota) = i as in curious, or 'ee'
- o (ο, omicron) = o as in dog (short o)
- o (ο, omicron) = o as in bone (long o)
- u (υ, upsilon) = u as in put, nose closed
- ai = (αι) ai as in aisle, i as in isle
- au = (αυ) au as in kraut or ow as in how
- ei = (ει) ei as in vein (long a)
- eu = (ευ) eu as in feud
- oi = (οι) as in oil, designates plural
- ou = (ου) as in soup, designates possessive
- ui = (υι) ui as in suite or w as in wheat
- ēi = (ηι) hu as in huge, "h'you"
